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AROUND YOUR PROPERTY

Your home may be your empire, but for the good our community, you are also responsible for the care of your yard, adjacent boulevards, sidewalks and the back alley.

Landscaping

Landscaping will both beautify your home, and increase property value!

The Land Use Bylaw and Drumheller Landscaping Policy outline specifics of Landscaping Standards for properties. The *front yard* shall be *landscaped* with grass, trees, shrubs, and/or flower beds. Areas of shale, rock, or other *hard landscaping* may be acceptable, but shall not exceed 25% of the *landscaped area*.

TIP: Drumheller has a desert climate. This means summers that are both hot and dry. Save yourself the cost of constantly watering lawns and gardens with hoses or irrigation. Use rain barrels, or better yet, explore zeroscaping or xeriscaping!

Boulevard Landscaping & Gardening

All Town boulevards adjoining the site shall be landscaped and maintained by the developer/ landowner. The Town of Drumheller really appreciates the care residents take in landscaping, maintaining, mowing and weeding the boulevards.

Town Trees

Taking care of trees on boulevards, centre medians and in parks is the responsibility of our Public Works department. If a tree on Town property needs care, please request a tree inspection with us by calling 403-823-1330.

Private Trees & Shrubs

Homeowners are responsible for making sure that hedges, trees and shrubs on their property don't interfere with pedestrians using the sidewalk or impede vision from vehicles on the street or alley. Please talk with your neighbours before trimming trees or branches near or overhanging your property line. The Town of Drumheller's Bylaw Team does not mediate private tree disputes. More often than not, lack of communication tends to be the "root" of the problem, so be sure to "branch" out to your neighbours!

TIP: Did you know that elm trees must not be pruned between April 1 and September 30 each year because of the threat of Dutch Elm Disease? It is against the law to prune, trim, cut, remove elms outside of October 1 and March 30.

Grass & Weeds

Property owners and renters are responsible to maintain a grass height of no more than 20cm. This does include the back alley and the boulevard! If a property is found to be in violation of the Community Standards Bylaw, fines start at \$250 and do not include any additional fees for contractor services hired for remediation. Unpaid fees are also levied to property owner's annual property taxes.

TIP: Residents across the Valley, from Nacmine to East Coulee, deserve peace and quiet.

Quiet hours in Drumheller are 10:00pm to 7:00am on weekdays and 10:00pm – 9:00am on weekends.

Fences & Hedges

The Town of Drumheller regulates fence and hedge maintenance and height; however, the Town will not get involved in property line disputes. It is recommended that property owners have their land surveyed by a professional.

Fences and Hedges in Drumheller can be as tall as 1.2 meters (4 feet) in front yards and secondary front yards, and a maximum of 1.8 meters (6 feet) in all other yards. However, heights for fences & hedges in Drumheller will vary dependant on your Land Use zoning. In some zones, fences and Hedges are not permitted in front or secondary front yards. Please check with the Development Authority prior to construction.

TIP: To avoid serious injury or worse, please contact Alberta One Call at1-800-242-3447 or albertaonecall.com at least 48 hours before you dig to locate all of the utility lines

HOME DEVELOPMENT

Boarders and Secondary Suites

A boarder is someone who rents sleeping accommodations in your home. This room does not have its own kitchen. The Town of Drumheller allows up to five boarders in a one-unit dwelling, and two boarders in each unit of a two-unit dwelling or semidetached home.

Secondary suites are self-contained living units created within houses. These suites include, but are not limited to, a kitchen, bathroom, independent heating and separate entrance. Secondary suites may be permitted in your Land Use zone and will require Development Permit. A Building Permit is required for all secondary suites to unsure the suite meets Alberta Building Core requirements.


Building Permits

New Builds are not the only project that requires a Building Permit. There are many projects that require permits including, but not limited to:

- or any deck with a roof;
- Garages;
- Carports;
- Garden and garage suites;
- Hot tubs and swimming pools;
- Secondary suites;
- Accessory buildings
- (larger than 10m2); Other related
- residential buildings.

For many applications, development permit approval is required before your building permit can be approved. To obtain a permit, please contact 403-823-1300 or safetycodes@drumheller.ca. Supporting documentation is required at submission for most **Building Permits.**

TIP: Keep your neighbours in the know! Talk to them, in person, about what you're planning to build, how long you expect the project to take and keep them informed if the work may affect them. Happy neighbours lead to healthy communities!



Drainage

Please make sure your yard is graded adequately to ensure water will flow to the alley or to the street, not toward your home or toward your neighbours!

Downspouts extending from the eavestroughs on your house or garage help keep rain and melting snow from entering or damaging your home, garage, or shed. Your home may also have weeping tile that wraps around the bottom of your foundation. Weeping tile collects water in the ground and drains it into a sump pit in your basement. The sump pump then discharges that water back above ground away from your house.

Please make sure your downspouts and sump discharges:

- Extend at least 2 metres (6.5 feet) away from any foundation;
- Are located at least 3 metres (10 feet) from any property line;
- Aren't directed toward neighbouring properties;
- Flow onto a permeable surface like a lawn or garden (not a Town sidewalk, street or back alley).

TIP: Sump pumps or downspouts should never empty onto sidewalks, streets, or back lands. This can cause a slippery and potentially dangerous situation.

Storm Drains

Rain and melting snow in Drumheller eventually flows into the Red Deer River through storm water drains.

TIP: Drumheller is a flood community. One of the many things you can do to help protect your home and neighbourhood is to never push snow, leaves, or other debris from your yard or boulevard onto the street, and never dumping anything into the storm drain.

Extension Cords

Well, it's no secret that Drumheller's climate can sometimes result in having to plug your vehicle in! Many neighbours park vehicles on public streets, and may have an extension cord cross over sidewalks to reach vehicles. The Town of Drumheller permits extension cords crossing over sidewalks, provided they are 2.13 metres (7ft) over the sidewalk.

Cords under this height across sidewalks can cause a tripping hazard!



Hot Tubs & Swimming Pools

Although swimming pools are not particularly common in Drumheller, please remember:

- Drain your pool/hot tub into your property's sanitary sewer line

 not onto the ground or into the storm drain. This is so the chlorinated water is treated at a wastewater treatment plant and not into the Red Deer River.
- Your pool must be enclosed by fencing before being filled with water and it must have a selfclosing gate.

Fire Pits

What's better than having a fire on a nice night? We don't think anything is, but please remember to:

- Burn only between 2:00pm and 11:00p.m. Barbecues and other outdoor cooking appliances are exempt;
- Keep your fire at least 3 metres (10 feet) from buildings, overhanging soffits, trees or anything combustible;
- Burn only dry, cut, seasoned firewood or charcoal briguettes;
- Please keep smoke and noise to a minimum;
- Don't forget the s'mores!

TIP: Pay attention to local fire advisory and fire bans by visiting Alberta Fire Bans' website. Be sure to subscribe to their notifications to stay in the know!

Back Alleys

Taking extra care in the appearance of your back lane shows pride of ownership, and encourages neighbours to do the same.

Waste collection bins should not be visible from the street. Overgrown weeds, grass and unwanted trees should be maintained. Other junk is a big no-no!

TIP: The Town of Drumheller requires all properties that have a back alley to properly identify their house number. That's right! Both at the front of the home and on a garage or structure that would be adjacent to the back.

Driveways

A development permit is required to ensure your driveway conforms to the landscaping standards of your land use zoning. Hard landscaping means the use of non-vegetative material, including, but not limited to: concrete, paving stone, asphalt, or gravel as part of a *landscaped area*. This includes your driveways.

Extending access to your driveway may require alteration to a Town boulevard or sidewalk.



Parking

Parking in Drumheller is predominately on-street parking, back alley, or driveway parking. Any vehicles, including RVs, parked on private property must be parked on a hard surface such as gravel, asphalt, or concrete.

Vehicles may not be parked or stored on front lawns. Any vehicle that does not have a valid license plate attached or is in a rusted, wrecked, inoperable or abandoned condition and is not stored within a garage is considered a junked vehicle and may be fined.

Parking on a residential street is considered a first-come-first-served basis in Drumheller, which can be challenging during the tourism season. Registered vehicles may be parked on any Town street for up to 72 hours. Unregistered vehicles will be towed and impounded.

RVs may not be parked on a residential city street for more than 36 hours and must be removed from all Town streets for at least 48 hours before being parked again.

Snow & Ice on Sidewalks

For everyone's safety, under the Town of Drumheller's Snow Removal and Ice Control Strategy (Council Policy C-01-21), residents and property owners must move and remove snow to reduce the potential for accidents and provide safe driving and pedestrian conditions.

The Town of Drumheller will ensure that snow is removed from roadways as long as the Town's financial resources, equipment and staff availability will allow.

TIP: Are you interested in being a good neighbour and creating relationships with the neighbourhood? Try being observant of those around you who may not be able to manage snow and ice removal! Whether they work long hours, are away on vacation, are not physically able, or any other reason, give them a call or knock on their door and offer to help if you're able to do so.

Pets

Responsible Pet Ownership

Many pets live and enjoy life in the Town of Drumheller; the beautiful trails and off-leash parks prove that amenities for four-legged friends are abundant.

The Town of Drumheller also advocates responsible pet ownership to ensure the safety and well-being of all animals and residents throughout the community.

As a responsible pet owner, pets are expected not to negatively impact other people, animals and the environment. Things associated with these responsibilities include proper waste disposal, noise control and not allowing pets to stray and wander.

There are many opportunities that allow for responsible and knowledgeable pet ownership. After all, pets are neighbours, too!

Pets at Large

Occasionally, pets can escape the safety of their permitted property and can become "at large". By having your pets licensed and wearing an issued license tag, pets are easily identified and can be returned home.

All cats and dogs over four months old must be licensed. You can purchase or renew pet licenses at drumheller.ca/live/town-services/ pet-licenses, in person at Town Hall, or any participating pet license vendors.

Pet licenses are valid for one year and must be renewed annually!

TIP: There is a \$250.00 fine for not licensing your dog or cat over 4 months old. While microchips are not licensing, they can be tied to a valid pet license. This ensures that you and your pet will be quickly reunited should they ever get lost.





Protection

The Town of Drumheller investigates complaints of animal abuse, cruelty and abuse.

You can also contact the Drumheller and District Humane Society by calling 403-823-8999.

If you suspect animal abuse or neglect, hording of animals or animals in distress, please contact the Town of Drumheller Emergency and Protective Services by calling 403-823-1360.

Livestock

The Town of Drumheller does not allow livestock in residential areas.

This includes, but is not limited to, cattle, sheep, swine, goats, llamas, horses, chickens, turkeys, water fowl and exotic animals.

Garbage & Recycling

Garbage Collection is managed by the Town of Drumheller. Disposal is managed by The Drumheller & District Solid Waste Management Association (DDSWMA). The DDSWMA operates as its own entity. Each Member County, Municipality and Town has a representative on the DDSWMA board of directors. Items included in the Town of Drumheller garbage collection and disposal budget include:

- Weekly curbside solid waste pick-up;
- The annual Community Clean
 Up program;
- Garbage carts.

The DDSWMA is approved by Alberta Environment and Parks to operate a Class II Municipal Sanitary Landfill, which currently serves a population of approximately 30,000 and receives 20,000-25,000 metric tonnes of Municipal, Industrial & Commercial/Institutional waste per year. TIP: You can discover your waste collection day by heading to our website. Simply put your address in the waste collection module, and your collection day will show up!

Home Occupation

Dinosaurs are not the only buried treasure in the Valley! Drumheller is home to a next-generation fibre-optic network bursting with opportunity for home-based business or telecommuters! Homebased business must obtain a business license from Town Hall. To learn more, visit the "Starting a Business" page on our website.

TIP: Home occupations may require a Development Permit. Home occupations are defined as means an accessory use by a resident of a dwelling.

Unit and/or Accessory Building, and may fall into one of three categories. Please check with Planning and Development to ensure you have the correct permits for your home occupation.

Businesses operating from a residence must have a license. To learn more, please contact 403-820-1307.



Untidy Properties

Nobody enjoys untidiness... And this translates over to other homes throughout the neighbourhood.

Any activity upon any property that is offensive to any person, or has or may have a detrimental impact upon any person or other property in the neighbourhood can provide a nuisance to neighbours.

We all want to live in a safe, attractive neighbourhood. Residents are responsible for ensuring that yards are kept free and clean from considerations that could prove to be a nuisance to neighbours. These things may include:

- Loose litter;
- Offensive odours;

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- A building or vegetation that interferes with or obstructs visibility, the sidewalk, or public work;
- The generation of excessive dust, dirt, or smoke;

- The excessive accumulation of or failure to dispose of discarded or dilapidated furniture or household appliances, scrap metals, scrap lumber and motor vehicle parts;
- The failure to dispose of any rubbish or garbage accumulated upon any property;
- Standing water that could pose a danger to the public;
- Damage or deterioration to the exterior of buildings or fences;
- The posting or exhibiting of posters, signs, billboards, placards, writings, or pictures upon any fence, wall, or any other property or parked vehicle, where the same are accumulated and become dilapidated and unsightly.

If you feel a building or yard is a threat to public health or safety, call Emergency and Protective Services at 403-823-1360. In an emergency, please call 911.

Making a Bylaw Complaint

Talking with your neighbour is one of the simplest ways of resolving a concern. Though, we do understand that this situation may not always be possible.

For situations where a conversation may not resolve concerns, residents may file a complaint with our Bylaw Department by contacting 403-823-1360.

While the Town of Drumheller's Bylaw Department does not accept anonymous complaints, they will keep your identity and complaint confidential. For the same privacy considerations, they cannot give you an update after they investigate. When you make your complaint, please ensure to include:

- Name, address and phone number of the complainant;
- Address of the property of concern;
- Detailed description of the complaint.
